2009 Boulevard Bolt

Nashville, Tenn. (Oct. 29, 2009) – The Boulevard Bolt, a Thanksgiving Day tradition in Nashville since 1994, returns for its 16th year. This five-mile run/walk along Belle Meade Blvd. drew about 8,000 registrants last year and has raised more than \$1.2 million benefitting Nashville’s homeless.

- WHAT:** 16th annual Boulevard Bolt, a five-mile run/walk to benefit Nashville’s homeless
- WHEN:** Thursday, Nov. 26, 2009 (Thanksgiving Day)
6 to 7:30 a.m. – Race day registration
8 a.m. – Race starts
9:30 a.m. (approximate) – Awards ceremony
- WHERE:** Start and finish lines are at St. George’s Episcopal Church, 4715 Harding Rd. at the corner of Belle Meade Blvd. Race-day registration is on site.
- WHO:** Open to participants of any age and competitive runners (no strollers or pets)
- COST:** \$25 per person by November 16; \$30 per person November 17 - 25; \$50 per person on race day
- REGISTER:** Go to www.active.com or www.boulevardbolt.org and register online or download form. Forms also available at Athlete’s House, Sport Seasons and YMCAs.
- DEADLINES:** November 17 – Mail-in registrations must be postmarked
November 20 by noon – Online registration deadline
November 25 by 4:00 p.m. – Walk-in deadline

ABOUT BOULEVARD BOLT:

The Boulevard Bolt is a collaborative volunteer effort organized annually by the following congregations located in Belle Meade: St. George’s Episcopal Church, The Temple, and Immanuel Baptist Church. All funds raised benefit the homeless in Nashville. Each year, organizations submit grant applications for consideration by the selection committee. The committee comprises members from all three congregations. Since its inception in 1994, the Boulevard Bolt has grown from 2,500 participants to nearly 8,000 in 2008 and has raised more than \$1.2 million directly benefitting Nashville’s homeless.
